Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

(a) Section 256 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 111, now appearing as Section 256 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 256. It is the policy of the state of Alabama to foster and promote the education of its citizens in a manner and extent consistent with its available resources, and the willingness and ability of the individual student, but nothing in this Constitution shall be construed as creating or recognizing any right to education or training at public expense., nor as limiting the authority and duty of the

legislature, in furthering or providing for education, to require or impose conditions or procedures deemed necessary to the preservation of peace and order.

"The legislature may by law provide for or authorize the establishment and operation of schools by such persons, agencies or municipalities, at such places, and upon such conditions as it may prescribe, and for the grant or loan of public funds and the lease, sale or donation of real or personal property to or for the benefit of citizens of the state for educational purposes under such circumstances and upon such conditions as it shall prescribe. Real property owned by the state or any municipality shall not be donated for educational purposes except to nonprofit charitable or eleemosynary corporations or associations organized under the laws of the state.

"To avoid confusion and disorder and to promote effective and economical planning for education, the legislature may authorize the parents or guardians of minors, who desire that such minors shall attend schools provided for their own race, to make election to that end, such election to be effective for such period and to such extent as the legislature may provide."

(b) Article XIV, Section 259, now appearing as Section 259 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to poll tax revenues, is repealed.

- (c) Amendment 90 relating to exemptions from the
 poll tax is repealed.
- 3 (d) Amendment 109 relating to exemptions from the 4 poll tax is repealed.

(e) Nothing in this amendment shall be construed to impliedly repeal or amend any local or general law or impliedly repeal or amend any provision of this constitution not specifically amended or repealed by this amendment.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 256 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to amend Section 256, as amended by Amendment 111, to remove references to race or color; to repeal Section 259, Amendment 90, and Amendment 109 relating to the poll tax; and to specify that nothing in this amendment shall be construed to impliedly repeal or amend any local or general law or impliedly repeal or amend any provision of this constitution not specifically amended or repealed by this amendment.
